

FESTIVAL

The Festival is for those children who are ready to take on other students from all around the world, answering any question up to 12 x 12.

Each multiplayer Festival game is one minute long and students earn 1 coin per correct answer. Roughly 1 in 5 questions are division.

A new Festival game starts every 15 seconds and there is no limit to the number of players that each game will accept.

FAQs

My child seems to be getting questions up to 12 x 12—why is that?

Assuming that it is not intentional, make sure they're playing in the Garage or Arena to get the tables we've set for them.

Why can't my child login?

Make sure school, username and password have been entered correctly. Speak to your child's teacher if there are still problems to login.

My child does not like their avatar?

Simply change the hair, eyes and mouth to suit individual preferences.

What is Times Tables Rockstars?

Times Tables (TT) Rockstars is a website for pupils to practise their times tables and improve their recall speed of their times tables.

It is recognised that times table recall speed is fundamental to later success in maths lessons.

Each pupil has their own personal rock name and avatar and by correctly answering questions they earn coins to spend on upgrading their avatar with instruments, outfits or rock accessories for example.

PLAYING GAMES

There are four game types as follows.

	Set by teacher	Questions up to 12x12
Single Player	"Garage" Highly rewarding—10 coins per answer	"Studio" Earn rock speed and status
Multi Player	"Arena" Compete against your classmates	"Festival" Take on the world

GARAGE

The Garage is the best place for mastering individual tables as it is highly rewarding (10 coins per correct answer) and allows teachers to decide what tables students are asked. Roughly 1 in 4 questions are division.

Students are able to decide whether to play in one, two or three minute games.

STUDIO

The Studio is where a pupil earns a Rock Speed and corresponding status (eg, Rock Star, Rock Legend or Rock Hero).

To start with, pupils complete their Baseline test, by playing ten games in the Studio mode. They then work to improve their speed and climb the statuses. The Rock Speed is based on the average score of their ten most recent games, which means a single bad performance does not have a big impact on the overall time or status.

Questions up to 12 x 12 will be asked during a one minute long game and the pupil will earn 1 coin per correct answer. Roughly 1 in 5 questions are division.

Much like being in a recording studio, this is where we want TT Rock Stars to record their best performances.

ARENA

The Arena is a multiplayer game where students can compete live against other children in their band (class), answering questions according to the schedule their Band Manager (teacher) has set.

Arena games are one minute long and students will earn 1 coin per correct answer. Roughly 1 in 5 questions are division.
